

**Mr. E. W. Stevenson**, electrical engineer of the Hazard Manufacturing Company of Wilkes-Barre, Pa., has resigned from that company to become sales agent for Messrs. Smith

& Nichols, manufacturers of waxes. Mr. Stevenson, who is well known in the electrical industry, has been engaged in almost every branch of the wire and cable business for thirty-four years. He was with the Hazard Manufacturing Company ever since it began the manufacture of insulated wire in 1899. Previous to that he spent four years as electrical engineer with the Okonite Company, and for two years previous to that he acted as consulting engineer. From 1880 to 1886 Mr. Stevenson was in the employ of the Telegraph, Construction &

Maintenance Company of London, Eng., and from 1889 to 1904 he was in charge of the underground cable circuits of the old Brush Electric Illuminating Company of New York. Before going with the Brush company he spent two years with the Commercial Cable Company. Mr. Stevenson's close work in the factory fits him well for his new work. He went to England last summer to "try himself out" and made a preliminary expedition three years ago with the same object in view. The firm with which he is now connected is a very old, well-established concern and has supplied the trade with waxes from the very beginning.
